

# How to Separate and Dispose of Garbage Properly

Please place it  
by **8:30 AM**

## ~Follow the Three Principles of Trash Disposal~

(Trash won't be collected if you failure to comply with the below)

- Designated TYPE** Properly separated in the **designated manner**
- Designated DAY** By **8:30 AM** on the designated day
- Designated PLACE** At the **gateway** for houses  
At the **designated place** for apartments

### Recyclables

#### Paper and cloth

##### Newspapers



\*Newspapers and flyers can be mixed together.

##### Miscellaneous paper and books



\*Remove plastic cover, etc. of the miscellaneous paper and bind them alone or insert them into books and tie them up.

##### Paper cartons



\*Rinse milk/drink carton, cut it open and dry.  
\*Cartons with aluminum or wax coating are "Burnable Trash."

##### Non-recyclable paper

Put out as Burnable Trash

- \*Paper cups, photographs, fax paper, etc.
- Tie up each type of material crosswise with a string. Do not put them in bags.
- They cannot be recycled if they are wet. Please skip taking out recyclable papers on rainy days.

##### Cardboards



\*Remove tape and staples

##### Clothing



- Old clothes  
Sweaters, jumpers, jeans, suits, etc.

Put out as Burnable Trash

Please put recyclables apart from other trash. It cannot be collected if it hides behind the trash.

#### Cans, bottles, PET bottles

Clear or semi-transparent bag

##### Cans



- Aluminum cans
- Steel cans  
canned food, cookies, oil, etc.

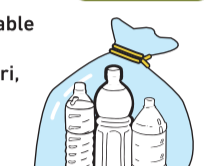
- Remove any remains and rinse lightly.
- Please separate each type accordingly and put it in the purchasable clear bags.
- Make sure to tie the bag's top before putting it out.

##### Bottles



- One-way bottles  
coffee, wine, sauce, jam
- Returnable bottles  
Awamori, beer
- Cosmetics bottles

##### PET bottles



- Plastic bottles  
caps
- This mark is a landmark.
- Recyclable PET bottle types  
Beverages, alcoholic beverages, seasonings

\*Please separate bottles and caps.  
\*Remove labels and dispose of as burnable trash.

Put out as Burnable Trash

\*Bottle of oil

### Town designated bags Burnable Trash

Make sure to tie the bag's top before putting it out.

- Kitchen waste**
  - Vegetable scraps
  - Tea dregs
  - Food waste
- Tree branches and plants**
  - Plant leaves (thin branches with leaves), etc., shall be put out in designated bags. Branches shall be no longer than 50 cm, and no thicker than 10 cm, and bundled as for one person to carry it. (Up to 2 bundles or 2 bags per time. \*Please dry it before putting it out.)
- Other**
  - Rubber
  - Leathers
  - Underwear
  - Tissue paper
  - Curtains
  - Diapers
  - Blankets, etc.
- Plastics**
  - Vinyl
  - Styrofoam
  - Video tapes
  - CD/DVD
  - Plastic bottles for detergents, etc.

\*Squeeze water out of kitchen waste!

\*Please tie futons with a string. (Designated bags are not required.)

\*Cooking oil shall be placed in a container and put out in a plastic bag.

**Household Garbage Disposal Units and Grants**  
Subsidies are available for those who wish to self-dispose of household food waste. For more information, please contact the Nousui Kankyo Anzen Section

No more than 5 bags per household of the designated bags.

### Town designated bags Non-burnable Trash

Make sure to tie the bag's top before putting it out.

- Metals**
  - Pots and pans
  - Kettles
  - Frying pans
  - Metal water pipes
  - Metal toys, etc.
- Glass and ceramic wares**
  - Glass cups
  - Hand mirrors
  - Teacups
  - Dishes
  - Vases
  - Earthenware pots, etc.
- Small appliances**
  - Irons
  - Dryers
  - Phone machines
  - Calculators
  - Home video game consoles
- Other**
  - Skating shoes
  - Screws
  - Paint cans, etc.

\*Refer to "Hazardous Waste" for broken glass, broken plates, etc.

\*Things that fit into small designated trash bags.

\*Refer to "Hazardous Waste" for batteries.

\*Contact your service provider for cellphones disposal.

\*Refer to "Hazardous Waste" for cans containing paint.

Please put out no more than 5 bags combining "Non-burnable Trash" and "Hazardous Waste" per household in the designated bags.

### Town designated bags Hazardous Waste

Make sure to tie the bag's top before putting it out.

- Fluorescent tubes and light bulbs**
  - Fluorescent tubes
  - Light bulbs
  - Mercury thermometers
  - Dry-cell batteries
- Lighters and spray cans**
  - Lighters
  - Spray cans
  - Gas cartridges etc.
- Broken glass, etc.**
  - Broken cups
  - Broken mirrors
  - Broken bottle
  - Cutlery, etc.
- Other**
  - Pushpin
  - Sewing needles
  - Nails
  - Cans containing paint, oil, etc.

\*Contact retailers and electronics stores for rechargeable dry-cell and button cell batteries.

\*Make sure to empty the containers.

\*When wrapping in paper, please label it with "キケン" and put in designated bag.

### Town designated disposal ticket Bulky Trash

Attach one disposal ticket per piece or bundle. Disposal tickets are available at the cashier of supermarkets and convenience stores.

- Yonabaru Town Bulky Trash Disposal Ticket**
  - sample large (大)
  - sample small (小)
- ¥900** For items 10 kg or more or 1 m or more in size.
  - Chest
  - Cupboard
  - Bed (mattress)
  - Sofa
  - Adult-sized bicycles
  - Full-length mirror
  - Strollers, etc.
- ¥450** For items up to 10 kg and up to 1 m in size.
  - Electric fan
  - Vacuum Cleaner
  - Legless chair
  - Gas stove

\*For needles, hangers (metal), cords, and umbrellas use Non-burnable Trash bags when putting out. (No Disposal Ticket required)

Up to one (大: large) and two (小: small) items at a time for collection. Attach the Disposal Ticket on the item and put it out.

## Trash not collected by the town

- One-time large amount of trash generated by moving, replacing tatami mats, DIY activities, etc. (Please carry-in directly)
- Garbage generated by the cleanup of vacant lots and cemeteries. (Please carry-in directly or self-dispose)
- Waste generated by new construction, expansion, renovation work, etc. (Have the contractor disposed of it)
- Industrial wastes such as construction waste, concrete, etc., as defined by law. (Contact industrial waste disposers)
- Chemicals, pesticides, deleterious chemicals, tires, batteries, etc. (Contact the distributor or specialized disposer.)
- Medical waste such as injection needles. (For injection needles and the like, please contact the respective medical institution)
- Trash generated by business activities of stores, companies, offices, etc. (Contract with a town licensed operator and have them collected it)

Soil, sand, and stones

#### Items prescribed by the Recycling Law

**Four home appliances** Please contact the sales outlet.

Televisions - Refrigerators (freezers) - Washing machines (clothes dryers) - Air conditioners

**PC** Please contact the manufacturer.

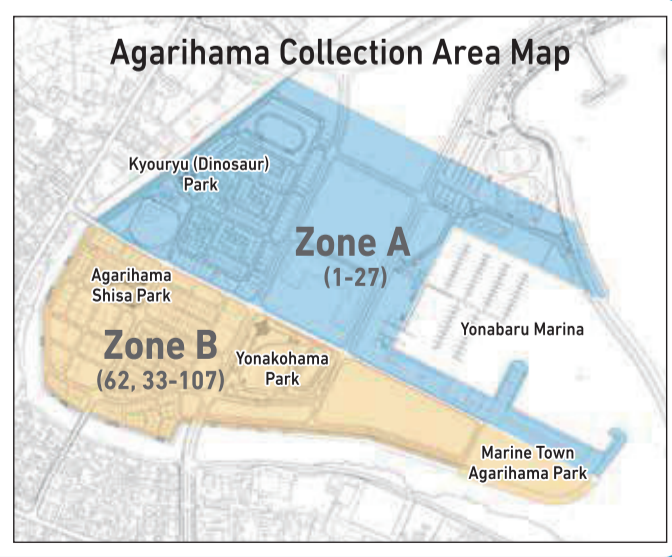
The main unit or display alone is also subject to the recycling law.

### No trash Collection

- Year-end and New Year's holidays
- Recyclables → DEC 30 to JAN 3
- Burnable trash → JAN 1 to JAN 3
- Children's Day (MAY 5)
- Labor Thanksgiving Day (NOV 23)
- In the event of a typhoon or major disaster

\*Trash collection will be suspended when a storm warning is in effect. Please do not take out trash during typhoons. If a temporary collection is to be made, it will be announced to the community.

### Trash Carried-in Directly

Individuals are responsible for the disposal of one-time large quantities of waste, such as when moving, DIY activities, etc. For such large volume of trash, you can carry it yourself to the Tobu Kankyo Bika Center after applying at the Seikatsu Kankyo Anzen Section of Yonabaru Town Office. For more information on direct carry-in trash, please contact the Seikatsu Kankyo Anzen Section.

**Illegal dumping and incineration are absolutely No-No**

Illegal dumping and incineration are prohibited by law. Violators are subject to imprisonment for up to five (5) years or a fine of up to 10 million yen. Do not illegally dump or incinerate.
